

JSAP Venues

The next of JSAP Spring Meeting will be held, March 28-31, 2003, at the Hachioji campus of Tokyo University of Technology.

The Tokyo University of Technology was founded in 1986 with the mission of nurturing engineers specializing in technological fields with a strong emphasis on electronics, mechatronics and information technologies. The University established its School of Media Science, the first of its kind in Japan, in 1999 and then the School of Bionics and the School of Computer Science this year. Over the relatively short span of less than 20 years, the University has grown rapidly and currently has a student population of about 4,500.

The University graduate school offers courses in Systems Electronics and Media Science.

The 400,000 square meter Hachioji campus is conveniently located 40 km west of central Tokyo, a 40 minute train ride from Shinjuku station. The city of Hachioji has a high concentration of universities, colleges and related educational establishments and provides an excellent environment for students.

Hachioji has many places of interest for visitors. Examples include the 1.5 km ruins of the 'Silk Road' between Gotenbashi Bridge and Otsukayama Park in the Yarimizu part of the city. This road was originally used for transporting raw silk to Yokohama bay for export from the end of Tokugawa until the middle of the Meiji era. For more energetic visitors, at an altitude of 600 meters, the top of Mt Takao offers breathtaking views of the distant peaks of Nikko, Tanzawa and Mt. Fuji as well as numerous trails along the slopes of the mountain.




