The 2007 JSAP Fall Meeting will be held at the Hokkaido Institute of Technology (HIT), September 4 to 8. The Campus is located about 55 minutes from JR New Chitose Airport Station by train or 20 minutes from JR Sapporo Station by train.

Hokkaido Institute of Technology (HIT) promotes engineering education aiming to nurture engineers who will preserve the global environment and create a sustainable and fertile society.

The fundamental idea of the education of HIT is “Harmonization of Humanity and Technology”, which will be evolved in the broad intellectual fields.

HIT aims to train students with various gifts, whether they are suited to arts or sciences, to be engineers who can play active roles in the coming society.

As we have now entered into 21st century and the political, economical and social structures are drastically innovating all over the world, the role of engineering in the society is changing to give priority to the sustainable development over the productivity. Since the foundation of HIT in 1967, over 20,000 engineers have graduated from six departments (Mechanical Eng., Industrial Eng., Electrical Eng., Electronics, Civil Eng., and Architecture). They are playing important parts in their respective fields not only in Hokkaido but all over Japan. From the above-mentioned point of view, however, HIT has transformed the educational structure into eight new departments (Environmental Design, Information Design, Biomedical Eng., Architecture, Civil Eng., Mechanical Systems Eng., Information Network Eng., Electrical & Electronic Eng.), from the former six in 2001.
